ANNUAL CHILD FIND MESSAGE FROM THE SPECIAL EDUCATION OFFICE (Adapted from District Policy 4321 and 4321.2)

The Board of Education of the Chatham Central School District is committed to providing all students, including those with disabilities, a free appropriate education in the least restrictive environment.

The Committee on Special Education (CSE) will identify, evaluate, and recommend placement of students with disabilities who are in need of special services or programs.

The Committee on Preschool Special Education (CPSE) is responsible for evaluation, recommendation and provision of special education programs and services for preschool students, ages 3-5, with a disability.

District residents with questions about CSE or CPSE programs may call the Director of Special Education at 392-2417.

SPECIAL EDUCATION SERVICES

If you suspect that your child may have a physical, cognitive, or emotional disability, you have the right to refer your child to the District's Committee on Special Education for an evaluation and a determination as to whether or not your child is eligible to receive special education services and programs.

WORKING PAPERS

TRANSPORTATION TO CHILDCARE LOCATIONS & PRIVATE SCHOOLS

If you are requesting transportation to and/or from a childcare provider, or if your child will be attending a private school, you must complete a Transportation Request Form each school year, even if your childcare or private school arrangements have not changed. Requests must be completed and returned to the following offices by April 1st in the school year prior to the need for transportation.

Parental Right to Request and Review Information Regarding Teacher Qualifications

Dear Parents and Guardians:

In accordance with the federal No Child Left Behind Act of 2001, parents and guardians have the right to request specific information about the professional qualifications of their children's classroom teachers. As a parent/guardian of a student in the Chatham Central School District, you have the right to request the following information:

- if the teacher has met New York State qualifications and licensing criteria for the grade levels and subject areas he or she teaches
- whether the teacher is teaching under emergency or other provisional status through which the state qualification or licensing criteria have been waived

- the teacher's college major; whether the teacher has any advanced degrees and, if so, the subject of the degrees
- if your child is provided services by any instructional aides or similar paraprofessionals provide services to your child and, if they do, their qualifications

Requests for information about the qualifications of your child's teacher can be directed to your child's building principal. All requests will be honored in a timely manner. Thank you for your continued support and interest in your child's education.

Request for Pesticide Application Notification

Dear Parents and Guardians:

The Chatham Central School District is required to maintain a list of persons in parental relation who wish to receive 48-hour prior written notice of certain pesticide applications. The following pesticide applications are <u>not</u> subject to prior notification requirements:

- anti-microbial products
- nonvolatile rodenticides in tamper-resistant bait stations in areas inaccessible to children
- nonvolatile insecticidal baits in tamper-resistant bait stations in areas inaccessible to children
- silica gel and other nonvolatile ready-to-use pastes, foams, or gels in areas inaccessible to children
- boric acid and disodium octaborate tetrahydrate
- the application of EPA-designated biopesticides
- the application of EPA-designated exempt materials under 40 CFR §152.25
- the use of aerosol products with a directed spray in containers of 18 fluid ounces or less when used to protect individuals from an imminent threat from stinging and biting insects including venomous spiders, bees, wasps, and hornets

In addition, there will be no written notice of such application when a school remains unoccupied for a continuous 72 hours following an application.

SEXUAL HARASSMENT POLICY SUMMARY

Harassment of students and staff on the basis of sex or sexual orientation is:abusive and illegal behavior

- behavior that harms victims and negatively impacts the school culture
- behavior that creates an environment of fear, distrust, intimidation and intolerance

The Chatham Board of Education:

- is committed to providing an educational and working environment that promotes respect, dignity and equality and that is free from all forms of sexual harassment
- condemns and strictly prohibits all forms of sexual harassment on school grounds, school buses and at all school-sponsored activities, programs and events including those that take place at locations outside the District

It shall be a violation of the District's Sexual Harassment Policy for any student, staff member or third party (school visitor, vendor, etc.) to sexually harass any student, staff member or third party.

It is essential that all victims of sexual harassment and persons with knowledge of sexual harassment **report the harassment immediately**. The District will promptly investigate ALL complaints of sexual harassment.

If, after appropriate investigation, the District finds that a student, a staff member or a third party has violated this policy, prompt corrective action will be taken in accordance with the applicable collective bargaining agreement, District policy and state law. All complainants and those who participate in the investigation of a complaint of sexual harassment have the right to be free from retaliation of any kind.

The information here is an excerpt from the Board of Education policy that was adopted in July, 2003. If you would like to see the full policy and detailed Sexual Harassment Regulations, please ask in any building office or the Superintendent's Office.

Students or parents should report any alleged misconduct to one of the building principals or the Sexual Harassment Compliance Officer, John Thorsen at 392-4142. Complaint Forms are available in any school office.

DIGNITY FOR ALL STUDENTS ACT (DASA) – INFORMATION ABOUT BULLYING

Bullying of a student by another student is strictly prohibited on school property, school buildings, school buses, and at school sponsored events or activities occurring on or off campus. The District also prohibits "Internet bullying" (also referred to as "cyberbullying") including the use of instant messaging, emails, websites, chat rooms, and text messaging when such use interferes with the operation of the school; or infringes upon the general safety and welfare of others.

Any student who believes that he/she is being subjected to bullying behavior, as well as any other person who has knowledge of or witnesses any possible occurrence of bullying, is urged to report the bullying to any staff member, the building principal, or one of the DASA coordinators listed below. Bullying allegations will be treated as confidential and private to the extent possible within legal constraints.

DIRECTORY INFORMATION ABOUT A STUDENT

The School may disclose directory information about a student to appropriate persons without prior parental consent. This may include:

- Student's name, address, telephone number (s) and e-mail address(es)
- Student's date and place of birth
- Major field of study and participation in officially recognized activities and sports
- Student's weight and height for members of athletic teams
- Dates of attendance ("from and to" dates of enrollment)
- Student's achievement awards or honors, date of graduation
- Student's grade level
- The most recent educational agency or institution attended
- Photographs and video/digital images are also considered to be "directory information" by the District and may be shared with the public through, for example, public media outlets, the District newsletters, reports, web site and other District communications, unless the parent/guardian or eligible student requests, in writing, that videotapes, digital movies or photographs of the student not be publicized
- Parents or eligible students (age 18 or older) have a right to request that such information NOT be released by the school. It is the responsibility of the parent or student to make these wishes known, in writing, to the building principal or superintendent.

Notification of Rights — Family Educational Rights and Privacy Act (FERPA)

The Family Educational Rights and Privacy Act (FERPA) affords parents and students over 18 years of age ("eligible students") certain rights with respect to the student's education records. These rights are:

- The right to inspect and review the student's education records within 45 days of the day the District receives a request for access. Parents or eligible students should submit to the school principal or Director of Special Education a written request that identifies the record(s) they wish to inspect. The District official will make arrangements for access and notify the parent or eligible student of the time and place where the records may be inspected.
- 2. The right to request the amendment of the student's education records that the parent or eligible student believes are inaccurate. Parents or eligible students may ask the District to amend a record that they believe is inaccurate. They should write the school principal or Director of Special Education, clearly identify the part of the record they want changed, and specify why it is inaccurate. If the District official decides not to amend the record as requested by the parent or eligible student, the District will notify the parent or eligible student of the decision and advise them of their right to a hearing regarding the request for amendment. Additional information regarding the hearing procedures will be provided to the parent or eligible student when notified of the right to a hearing.
- 3. The right to consent to disclosures of personally identifiable information contained in the student's education records, except to the extent that FERPA authorizes disclosure without consent.
 - **a.** One exception, which permits disclosure without consent, is disclosure to school officials with legitimate educational interests. A school official is a person employed by the District as an administrator, supervisor, instructor, or support staff member (including health or medical staff and law enforcement unit personnel); a person serving on the District Board of Education; a person or company with whom the District has contracted to perform a special task (such as an attorney, auditor, medical consultant, or therapist); or a parent or student serving on an official committee, such as a disciplinary or grievance committee, or assisting another District official in performing his or her tasks. A school official has a legitimate educational interest if the official needs to review an education record in order to fulfill his or her professional responsibility.
 - b. FERPA also authorizes the release of "directory information" without prior consent, unless the parent/guardian or eligible student (age 18 or older) requests, in writing, that directory information not be disclosed. The District considers the following information "directory information":
 - Student's name, address, telephone number(s) and e-mail address(es);
 - Student's date and place of birth

- Major field of study and participation in officially recognized activities and sports
- Student's weight and height for members of athletic teams
- Dates of attendance ("from and to" dates of enrollment)
- Student's achievement awards or honors, date of graduation
- Student's grade level
- The most recent educational agency or institution attended

Photographs and video/digital images are also considered to be "directory information" by the District. Videotapes, digital movies and/or photographs may be shared with the public through, for example, public media outlets, the District newsletters, reports, web site and other District communications, unless the parent/guardian or eligible student requests, in writing, that videotapes, digital movies or photographs of the student not be publicized.

Two federal laws require the District to provide military recruiters and institutions of higher education, upon request, with three directory information categories of its secondary students: names, addresses and telephone numbers, unless parents or students have advised the District that they do not want this information disclosed without their prior written consent.

Those parents/guardians or eligible students who do not want directory information released and/or do not want videotapes, digital movies and/or photographs published and/or do not want the limited release of directory information to military recruiters and/or institutions of higher education, must notify the District in writing by September 18, 2015 regarding the desired limitations on release of directory information. Written requests should be sent to your child's building principal.

- **c.** The District, as authorized by FERPA, discloses personally identifiable student information without consent to other schools, school systems or institutions of postsecondary education in which a student seeks or intends to enroll or that are providing services to the student, upon receiving a request from any such institution. Parents/guardians or eligible students can receive a copy of all information disclosed upon request.
- 4. The right to file a complaint with the U.S. Department of Education concerning alleged failures by the Chatham Central School District to comply with the requirements of FERPA.
